

European business schools gather at HEC Paris for the 26th "MBA Olympics" HEC PARIS, LBS, IE finish in TOP 3

1,500 MBA student athletes competed in 23 different sports last week-end. For the past 26 years, the "MBAT" Tournament has been held and organized at HEC Paris. Students from all over Europe left their Excel spreadsheets, market segmentations, and SPSS analyses to challenge one another in climbing, swimming, running, and other sports activities.
