





Pascal Canfin has been Chair of the European Parliament's Environment, Public Health and Food Safety (ENVI) Committee since 2019, and is one of the main architects of the Green Deal. Pascal was recently ranked as one of the top 3 most influential political leaders on European environmental policy by Politico, a specialist media outlet on European issues. As an MEP in the centrist group Renew, he was instrumental in the adoption of a European Parliament declaration on the urgency of climate change in 2019. Prior to this position, Pascal Canfin was Director General of WWF France from 2016 to 2019. From 2014 to 2015, he was Senior Climate Advisor at the World Resources Institute and co-chaired the Commission on Innovative Climate Financing. In 2012, he was Minister Delegate for Development at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs during F. Hollande's presidency. From 2009 to 2012, he was also a member of the European Parliament.

In March 2021, Elodie Bernadi was appointed Sustainability and CSR Director at L'Oréal France (which brings together the fifty brands of the L'Oréal Group in France) and, as such, is in charge of the transformation of the entity's model across its four divisions.



Adelaide Charlier is a Belgian activist fighting for climate and social justice. She co-founded the Youth for Climate movement in Belgium. She is mainly known for her involvement in the fight against climate change. Inspired by the actions of Greta Thunberg, she is one of the leading figures, alongside Kyra Gantois and Anuna De Wever, of the first school strikes for climate in Belgium. She fights a lot in Brussels to encourage the adoption of ecological laws.



Climate activist and philosopher at ENS Lyon, Claire has worked in different institutions and political organisations, especially in the European Parliament on climate politics and migrations. His activities often lead him to speak in the media and conferences on various themes related to ecology.

Dr. Nicolas Plain is a French scientist, economist and engineer. He is a graduate of the Ecole Polytechnique Paris, the Corps des Ponts et Chaussées, the University of Berkeley, holds a PhD in economics and climate sciences from the University of Grenoble and is a member of the high French administration. Early on, he focused his energy on climate with various experiences in strategy consulting firms (BCG) and large companies (EDF, Météo France). He then joined the interministerial team in the cabinet of the Minister Ségolène Royal for COP21 and COP22. In 2020, Nicolas became ambassador of the European Union to accelerate the climate and energy transition in the Alpine territories, and is involved as an expert for the Solar Impulse Foundation. He also helps large scale companies like Schneider Electric to define their sustainable development and CSR strategies. At the same time, Nicolas is involved in scientific exploration all around the world. In 2015, he founded "Fly for the Earth" to interview paragliding scientists in order to popularize their knowledge. In 2019, he created the collection of documentaries "Save!", where, with his flying laboratory, he meets and interviews women and men who find concrete solutions on the ground to accelerate the ecological and social transition. In 2021, he was elected Fellow member of the Explorers Club, the highest distinction in the world of scientific exploration. In June 2021, he built the Dream Catcher project, an ultralight aircraft transformed into a real flying laboratory for green hydrogen. In 2022, he founded and now chairs the RISE foundation, which integrate a worldwide documentary collection to influence public and private decisionmakers.


